Privacy Policy:

The Department of Education has a policy that schools follow to ensure student and parent information is kept private and only used by a school in certain circumstances. The policy is distributed to the school community at the start of each year and is included in today's newsletter.

COVID Reminder:

COVID precautions are still in place at schools, including increased ventilation, air purifiers and masks. Students in Grades 3 to 6 are required to bring a mask from home to wear while inside. It is recommended that students in Foundation to Grade 2 also wear masks.

If your child tests positive using a Rapid Antigen Test, please contact the school and register the result on the Department of Health website. Students who test positive (or are a household contact of a positive case) are required to isolate at home for 7 days and can return to school if they are symptom free on Day 8. We will continue to notify the school community if a positive case has attended the school.

Welcome back! We have had a great start to the year in the Peppermint Gums classroom. This week the students in grades 1 and 2 have been working on establishing our routine and understanding expectations. We have had a big focus on talking about our emotions

and identifying ways to regulate our feelings in the classroom to help and support our learning. After recess and lunch, we have been engaging in some mindfulness using the app smiling minds. This is helping us re-center and regulate our emotions. We have been working on building our growth mindset, making sure we working collaboratively with our friends, sharing and talking positively with others.

During literacy we have been working on practicing our handwriting, making sure we are forming our letters correctly. We have been practicing our M100 and M200 words to help us become more confident readers and exploring our alphabet dominoes by matching the starting letter with the word or picture. During numeracy we have been working on our fluency with addition, using our addition strategies counting on and using our fingers.

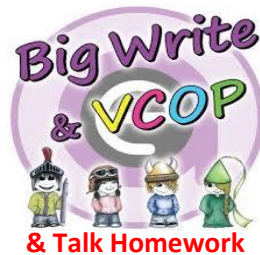

The Blue Gums Studio is off to a flying start. We have already begun to settle into routine. I am really looking forward to a fabulous year. Reader records haven't yet been sent home, this will begin next week. Students are asked to read for 10-15 minutes (or longer) each night if possible otherwise at least 3 nights a week. I encourage students to read what they enjoy, however as explained to the students a variety of genres is encouraged from both fiction and non-fiction texts.

10 Benefits of Reading-

- ✓ Children who read often and widely get better at it.
- ✓ Reading exercises our brain.
- ✓ Reading improves concentration.
- ✓ Reading teaches children about the world around them.
- ✓ Reading improves vocabulary and language skills.
- ✓ Reading develops a child's imagination.
- ✓ Reading helps children to develop empathy.
- ✓ Reading is a fun.



An important part of the Literacy curriculum in our Blue Gums studio is 'Big Write'. 'Big Write' is an exciting and effective way of encouraging children to think about four key areas for developing both their spoken and written language: Vocabulary, Connectives, Openers and Punctuation. Children take part in a variety of oral and written activities and games to develop their skills in these areas.

As part of this work children in the Blue Gums will complete a piece of writing once a fortnight on a Thursday morning.

Research shows that children need to develop confidence in using language verbally before they can use it in their writing. In order for children to produce their best writing they are encouraged to discuss the topic in advance. Discussion work always forms a key part of our 'Big Write' sessions.

A couple of days before their writing, children will be given information about the Thursday's task. I ask that children discuss the topic with an adult/family member at home, in preparation for their writing. This is a discussion only! Children who complete their 'Writing Topic Talk' regularly feel more confident in tackling their written tasks.

SOME HINTS FOR A TOPIC TALK:

- Encourage as many family members as possible to be involved in the conversation.
- Make it an enjoyable activity.
- Switch off the television & tech to try to ensure that this is dedicated talking and listening time.
- Begin a conversation by modelling... "I think that... because ..."
- Ask other family members to give their ideas, opinions and reasons why.
- Encourage thinking about exciting words to use to make their writing more interesting

4. Enter the product item number shown on the Book Club catalogue
5. Make payment via credit card.
