

Welcome back to Term 3! Our students have settled back into school very well, catching up with friends and enjoying playing and learning together again after the holidays.

On the Curriculum Day on Monday, our staff spent the day in professional development on the new Department of Education Child Safety Policies for Schools, planning for the new Disability Inclusion Profile Process for students with additional learning needs, spent time on the Writing and Mathematics curriculum and analysing student achievement data. The work staff do on these days is to support student wellbeing and their learning.



A reminder student's reading diaries are due each Friday and remembering to bring this helps builds upon their organisation skills. Four mornings/nights per week of reading is the expectation. Homework is optional and welcome to be handed in anytime! I do print a literacy/numeracy sheet covering a wide variety of skills, which students have access to each week. They are also welcomed to bring in anything else they work on at home.
