Lunch Orders

Uniform Pricing

Bushfire Emergency Procedures

As the school is located next to bushland, the school is a designated school on the Bushfire Register. The administration building is our designated shelter-in-place building, and emergency procedures are in place. Our school is located in the Bureau of Meteorology - Central Fire District.

On days of *Catastrophic Fire Danger Rating*, the school and Club 1878 will be closed. Parents will receive notification via Compass the day prior.

On days of *Extreme Fire Danger Rating,* the school will operate from Woodman's Hill Secondary College. Club 1878 will not operate on this day. Parents will receive notification via Compass the day prior.



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If a fire starts during a school day, and the CFA and emergency services have concerns or the school is smoke affected, students and staff relocate to the Administration (shelter-in-place building. The CFA and emergency services will direct school staff and students in this situation. Parents will be notified via Compass, with instructions on what action they should take (for example, to collect your child from school, from an alternative location or to await further notification from the school).

It is important that parents ensure they have access to the Compass App on their mobile phone, to receive these notifications.

Facilities

Upgrades to the Administration Building (our designated shelter-in-place building) have taken place over the past two days. Upcoming groundworks include, Alison's Garden, flag poles and retaining walls around the bottom playground, to assist with soft-fall retention. Later in the year, a Therapy Room will be built in the Administration building. The Therapy Room will be a private comfortable space for allied health professionals to work with students, and also a relaxing meeting space.
