

Student Dress Code

PURPOSE

The purpose of the Student Dress Code is to outline Little Bendigo Primary School's requirements for student dress and appearance and to provide information about uniform purchase and support, dress code implementation and exemption processes.

This dress code has been developed by Little Bendigo Primary School's School Council in close consultation with our school community to ensure that it respects the rights of individual students whilst reflecting the values and interests of our community.

The Student Dress Code aims to:

- foster a sense of community and belonging and encourages students to develop pride in their appearance
- support Little Bendigo Primary School's commitment to ensuring that our students feel equal and are dressed safely and appropriately for school activities.
- reduce student competition on the basis of clothing
- enhance the profile and identity of the school and its students within the wider community.

The School Council has developed a dress code that we believe provides a range of choices for students and is cost effective for families.

SCOPE

Students are expected to comply with this Student Dress Code while traveling to and from school, during school hours and when attending school activities.

UNIFORM AND APPEARANCE

The full list of Little Bendigo Primary School's compulsory school uniform items are available at Appendix A to this policy.

General appearance

While at school, travelling to or from school or participating in school activities, Little Bendigo Primary School students must comply with the following:

- Uniforms must be clean and in good repair
- Uniforms must be clearly marked with the owner's name
- Additional layers of clothing may be worn underneath the uniform for added warmth, provided these undergarments are of similar colour or neutral (black/white).

Jewellery and cosmetics

Students are not permitted to wear decorative jewellery to school. Stud earrings and sleepers worn in the ears, and watches, are the only acceptable jewellery.

Cosmetics may not be worn at school. Only clear nail polish is permitted.

Hair and Sun safety

Shoulder length or longer hair is to be tied back to help restrict the spread of nits and lice and for student safety.

School uniform hats must be worn outside from mid-August (exact date to be set by the school annually) to 30 April and on any other day prescribed by the school. School uniform hats may also be worn outside of this time period, by parent or student choice.

Hats are not to be worn inside.

Students are permitted to wear sunglasses during outdoor activities. Sunglasses should be close-fitting, wrap-around that meet the Australian Standards 1067 and cover as much of the eye area as possible.

PURCHASE OF UNIFORMS

Uniform items can be purchased from the office at school. Parents order the girl's winter tunic directly from Beleza School Uniforms, Shop 2, No.24 Doveton Street North.

Support for families experiencing difficulty

Please contact the Principal to discuss support that we may be able to provide to families experiencing difficultly meeting uniform costs, including information about eligibility for uniform support through State Schools' Relief. IMPLEMENTATION

Little Bendigo Primary School will ensure that this Student Dress Code is communicated to all families and students through our website and newsletter. We will assist students who may be experiencing difficulties complying with this policy where possible.

If a student is out of school uniform or otherwise breaches the Student Dress Code on a recurring basis, the Principal may contact the parents.

EXEMPTIONS TO STUDENT DRESS CODE

We recognise that there may be situations where the application of this dress code may affect students unequally.

Students and their parents or carers may apply either in writing or in person to the Principal for an exemption to this Student Dress Code if:

- an aspect of this code prevents the student from complying with a requirement of their religious, ethnic or cultural beliefs or background
- the student has a particular disability or health condition that requires a departure from the dress code
- the student or their parents/carers can demonstrate particular economic hardship that prevents them from complying with the dress code.

When the Principal receives a request for an exemption, they will:

- consider the grounds for the exemption request
- explain the process to the student and/or their parents/carers
- encourage the student and/or their parents/carers to support their application with evidence.

The Principal or delegate will then try to negotiate a resolution that is acceptable to all parties. If an exemption is not allowed, then written reasons will be provided to the student and/or their parents or carers.

APPENDIX A: LITTLE BENDIGO PRIMARY SCHOOL UNIFORM ITEMS

All year round

The following items may be worn all year round, as either the summer or winter uniform:

Jumper or Vest

Royal blue polar fleece with school logo Royal blue windcheater with school logo Royal blue vest fleece with school logo

Shirts

Gold long and short sleeved with school logo Gold short sleeved t-shirt with school logo

Shorts

Royal blue shorts without decoration or brand name

Skorts

Royal blue skorts
Royal blue Sport Skort with gold piping.

Dresses

Summer blue and white checked dress Winter tunic, navy blue skirt with detachable bib, with gold royal blue check

Pants

Plain, royal blue track pants without decoration or brand name

School Rain Coat (Optional Item)

Royal Blue coat with school logo

Hats – to be worn from mid-August to 30 April

Royal blue bucket hat with school logo.

Royal blue broadbrim hat with school logo.

Royal blue legionnaire hat with school logo.

Sports uniform

There are specific uniform requirements for students participating in specialist sports such as netball, or football. These uniforms are provided by the school for the duration of the sports season.
